- b. Students may also be excluded from class for failure to pay fees that he/she was required to pay in order to undertake or cont nue the course, as stated in the writ en agreement
- c. Where the College intends to exclude a student from class it will first issue a let er which not fies the student and parents of this intent on. The let er will provide details of the reason/s for the intended exclusion, as well as informat on about how to access the College's internal appeals process. Further informat on about the appeals process in the

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the event of a school-init ated cancellat on is outlined below.

- c. The College is required to report any confirmed breach of course progress and at endance requirements to the Department of Immigrat on. Where a student is reported for breach of visa condition, his/her enrolment at the College will be cancelled and this may impact on the student's visa. Further informat on can be found in the College's Course Progress and At endance Policy.
 - i. For the durat on of the internal appeals process, the College will maintain the student's enrolment and the student will at end classes as normal. The Principal will determine if part cipat on in studies will be in class or under a supervised arrangement outside of classes
 - ii. If a student decides to access the College's complaints and appeals process because they have been not f ed of a College init ated suspension or cancellat on of enrolment under Standard 9, the change in enrolment status will not be reported in PRISMS unt I the internal complaints and appeals process is f nalised, unless extenuating circumstances relating to the welfare of the student apply (see Definitions below)
 - iii. Where extenuating circumstances are deemed to exist, a student may still access the complaints and appeals process, but the College need not await the outcome of this process before changing the student's enrolment status in PRISMS. If the College has issued a CAAW for such a student, welfare provisions under Standard 5.6 are applicable
 - iv. The use of extenuat ng circumstances by the College to suspend or cancel a student's enrolment prior to the complet on of any complaints and appeals process will be supported by appropriate evidence
 - v. The final decision for evaluating extenuating circumstances lies with the Principal

Student to seek informat on from Department of Immigrat on

a. Deferment, suspension and cancellat on of enrolment can have an effect on a student's visa as a result of changes to enrolment status. Def nit ons

- a. Day any day including weekends and public holidays in or out of term t me
- b. Extenuating circumstances if the student's health or wellbeing, or the wellbeing of others, is likely to be at risk

Examples include:

- the student refuses to maintain approved welfare and accommodat on arrangements (for students under 18 years of age)
- the student is missing
- the student has medical concerns or severe depression or psychological issues which lead the College to fear for the student's wellbeing
- the student has engaged or threatened to engage in behaviour that is reasonably believed to endanger the student or others
- is at risk of commit ng a criminal of ence, or
- the student is the subject of invest gat on relating to criminal matiers.
